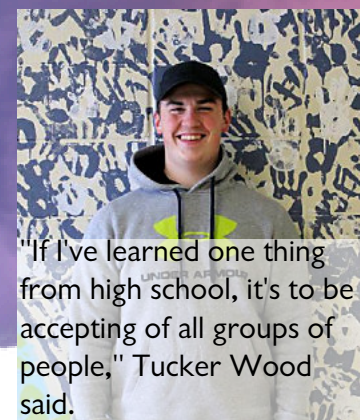


Carter Morgan supports the Lynx at one of the last football games he'll attend as a senior. "I came, I saw, I flunked," Morgan said.

Dominiqué Doiron proudly holds her braids and flute. "The band uniforms were always itchy," Doiron said.



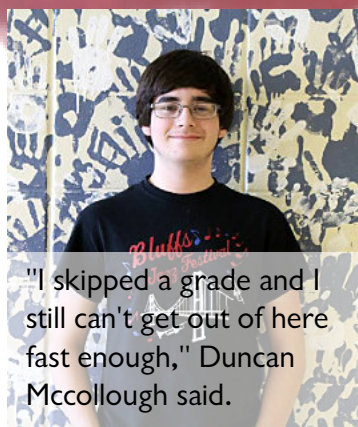
