ON APRIL 28, 2015, National Superhero Day, West lost a student, a friend, an athlete and a young man to stage three T-cell lymphoma. His name was Austin "Flash" Schroeder, and little did anyone know the impact he would leave on the student body. His name, baseball number and story are a powerful reminder to "Win the Day."

"Win the Day meant giving the best effort every single play, pitch, basketball game, football, baseball, whatever sport you're playing," Craig Schroeder said. "Every single minute, give your best effort that you possibly can."

This mantra was repeated during Flash's sports career and again during his treatments. "Win the Day" is the heart of the Flash Foundation, which works to help kids like Flash.

"[The Foundation] is really his wish. It's his legacy," Craig Schroeder said. "The Foundation itself isn't just about raising money, cancer awareness and helping families that go through it. That's really the cancer piece of it. But it's still about Win The Day. It's still about spreading that message as much as we can."

Flash's relationship with Patrick McCaffery '19 strengthened when each got news of his cancer.

"We both got cancer around the same time, so it took our relationship to another level ... we had such a good understanding of what the other was going through," McCaffery said.

When she got the call Flash had passed away, Belle Parker '18 went to the hospital.

"It was hard, because that was the first time that I got to tell him that I loved him, and I think I wish would have told him sooner."

Flash would have graduated in May, but his name and his story have kept his memory alive. "He was one of us, so understanding what he

went through and how he handled it truly speaks to who he was," Carter Johnson '18 said.

Austin Geasland '18 added, "That's what makes his story so specal to the people close to him." -By Sidney Kout


