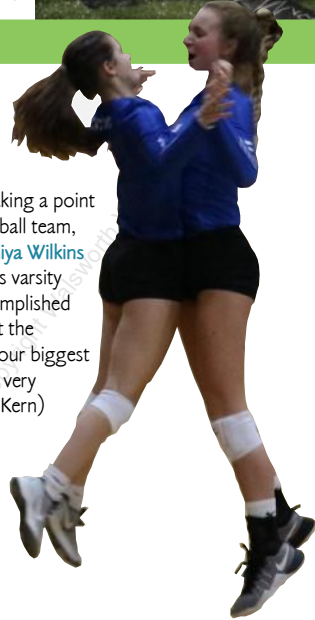


3. **Stars and Stripes**
