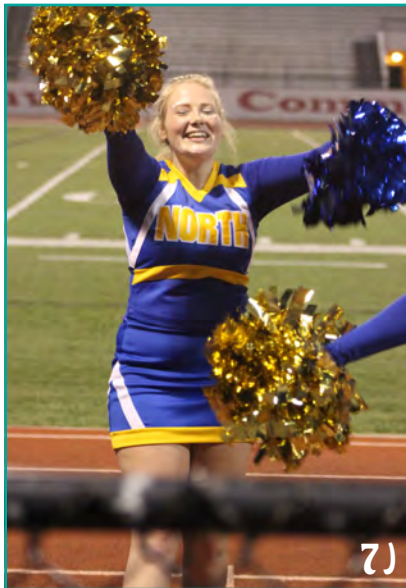
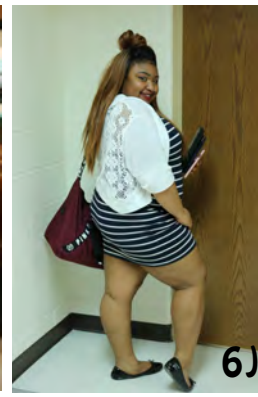


Cat 'n' mouse
