Girls' Track and Field

On your mark, get set, go! Feet hit the ground as soon as the starting shot booms throughout the stadium. The Waukee Girls' Track and Field Team had a banner year with various records broken and a third consecutive state championship. "We qualified for 14 out of 16 events at the Drake Relays and all 19 events at state," stated head coach Jesse Hunt, Des Moines Register's girls' track coach of the year. "We set the state record for a 4A school with 122 points, which is incredible," added Hunt. "Everyone had a championship mindset that helped the team work even harder to capture the state title," said senior Sydney Winger. Waukee has taken home the state title six of the past ten years.

The girls' track and field season kicks off in February with practices every day of the week, leading up to big meets such as Drake Relays or the state championships. This was the first year Waukee won the Hy-Vee Relays Cup at the Drake Relays. "The quantity of practices isn't necessarily larger, but the quality is improved," explained Hunt. The girls' hard work played a huge factor in their success. "Everyone is putting out their best effort. Every day at practice, I don't hear any complaints or anything," stated junior Janjay Peters.

As state approaches, the intensity heightens. "A lot more preparation into [state], we prepare the whole week before instead of just a day before," junior Delaney Taylor explained, "A lot of us run a lot faster times at state because we know that more is on the line."

Working together for so long every day, the track team grew a strong bond together. "I remember we were going to a meet and we were waiting for the buses to get here, but none of the charter buses showed up. Everyone was standing around freaking out! We had to call parents to come help take everyone to the meet," stated Peters, "I thought it was really cool that even though everyone was nervous we still went out there and dominated that meet." The relationships built through the sport grew more dynamic as time went on.

"We're like a big family," said Winger "Everyone has a place on Waukee's track team and all the individuals work towards the same goal."

As the three year state champions, Waukee girls' track and field team hopes to carry the momentum into next year's season. "Even in the off season this team [will] do great things," senior Logan Akason explained "So many girls were training and working out which gives me a really good feeling about the season to come."
