Highlights of the CJU45 season included, received a Superior I rating at State Show Choir festival, placed 1st in

the 2A division at all four competitions, made finals at all four competitions, and won the following caption awards: Best Vocals, Best Choreography, Best Crew, and Most Entertaining Show.

CJU45 placed 4th runner up at Mount Pleasant, 5th runner up at Pella, 2nd runner up at Central Lee, and 4th runner up at Fort Madison.

Ben Shortt won Outstanding Performer at Pella. Olivia Naber won Outstanding Performer at Central Lee. There was no Outstanding Performer Award at Mt. Pleasant or Ft. Madison.

Overall, Chris Reed was very happy with CJU's season performance, "I am so proud of this year's CJU45;

singers, band, and crew! Our goal from the beginning of the year was for CJU45 to be one of the most entertaining show choirs out there, and we achieved that goal.
