n April 28, 2022, Ema Cardenas, a 14-year-old East High student was walking home from school on the 1600 block of E. University Avenue. She was a victim of a hit and run and died from her injuries. This was a turning point for Anna Campos, Cardenas's mom, it led her to seek change in the district and run for the school board, which she won on November 6 with 59 percent of the

Campos has a couple reasons she decided to campaign. After the East High shooting that left one dead and two seriously injured on March 7,2022, then following that, a hit and run that killed her daughter, she decided to take charge.

"After the shooting at East and Ema's hit and run death, I found myself in a spot where my mental health was declining. I did not want another parent to go through what we went through with these two major tragedies. I had two choices. One, to fight for change or two, to be in a dark place. The East High community is why I ran. We are a great community, and we are overlooked," Campos said.

Campos is from the Eastside of Des Moines, she is an East High alumni, class of 1999. She lived on the south side for a couple of years but moved back to the East side so that her kids could go to Hiatt and East.

ly major goals right now are to be present a<u>nd</u> be involved with all my district's schools, working on uniting our district, school safety, and advocating for high public-sel funding.

Campos wants to help and see various changes in the district. She believes that everyone needs to work better as a community. Being able to support students no matter who they are. One that is super important to her is teacher and staff support. "DMPS has been notorious for not being transparent with the community, teachers, or staff. We have teachers leaving the district because they feel that they have no support from the board, nor the superintendent. This is from the previous administration. COVID being one example, another being when the board conducted those family forums after our shooting at East, nothing came out of it. Things need to change. With a new superintendent and two new board members, I feel that we can work together and find ways to keep great teachers and staff," Campos said.
